They are just 7 8 recently sent out the third attempt letters to the property owners. 9 10 So we're way ahead of schedule; here it is, as you know, just beginning of April. So we have 11 12 plenty of time to try and get as many inspections done as possible and give the people the 13 opportunity to have the most accurate data 14 collected about their homes. 15 16 We're at the beginning phases. I'm going to be creating new line items for billboards that 17 were discovered in Verona and we'll be putting 18 those on. And then there's also a couple of cell 19 20 phone antenna towers that are on top of buildings that we are going to address. 21 Beyond that, Chapter 91s will be going out 22 shortly. And we'll be starting that analysis --23 24 the measurements of all the commercial properties

pretty much complete.

SENATE BILL 2029 14 15 PRESIDENT MATARAZZO: The Senate Bill --16 17 Thank you, Kenya. Senate Bill 2029. 18 19 MS. CODEY DURKIN: Right. 20 In your folders is a copy of Ocean County's Tax Board resolution opposing the Senate Bill. 21 And I've included a copy of the bill in your 22 folders. 23 24 The assessors are going to meet that are here after our meeting to discuss that bill. 25

It's an 23 updated thing that says, you know, where we are. 24 25 On next month's agenda, May 1st, I probably
